Home Schooling Fund


When the government announced the closure of schools back in January, we set up an emergency fund to ensure that no railway child would go without the essential equipment needed for home schooling.

The fund was created as an emergency measure when it was apparent that many families did not have the equipment to effectively home school, with classes and homework being conducted on parent's mobile phones or having to share tablets and laptops between children.

Support was available from schools and the government, but those identified as most in need were prioritised. This left a gap in sufficient support for home schooling for those in employment with limited means to purchase the required devices for their children. Because of the generous support we receive, we have been able to award over £40,000 to help over 100 families and give 217 children the home schooling equipment they needed.



New - Children's Fund

The demand and success of the Home Schooling Fund has led us to make some important changes to our Family Support Fund.

We're excited to relaunch the fund as our Children's Fund. This fund is here to support our children and their development. Sometimes a helping hand is needed for the hidden extras that always seem to crop up when you least expect them - the growth spurts that lead to more new shoes and school uniform, the trips that need paying the same month as the car repairs, the gym lessons that all their friends go to but it's just too much of a stretch when you've got to buy the kit as well.

Our children's education is so important and the demand for our Home Schooling Fund has shown how a little extra support can make all the difference. We want to highlight that the fund will be available for additional learning needs such as private tutoring or summer schools.

We understand that times are tough, which is why we've increased our eligibility criteria for the Children's Fund from £30,000 gross household annual income per annum to £40,000 to make this fund more accessible to those in need. In addition, the maximum amount awarded was previously £200 and will now be £300 in line with the increase in cost of the things we need.

The application process has also been streamlined to make it easier and quicker to apply. Once you have completed a short form and provided proof of employment then you are ready to go and, if awarded, the money will be paid directly into your bank account within days.
