Rail is changing and the RBF will be here, every step of the way, as we have been for more than 160 years.

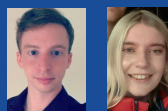
We can guide you through life's unexpected events or changes in circumstances, offering advice and financial support to those who need it.

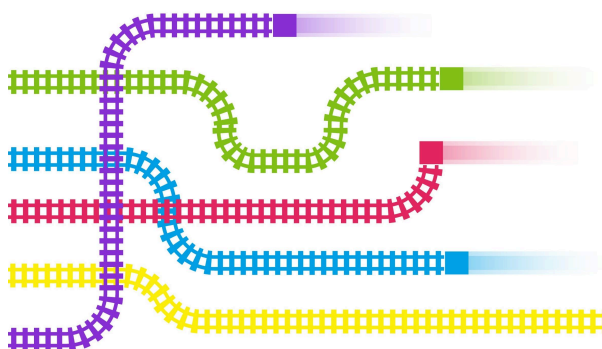
Findings showed that many are worried about loss of earnings leading to more financial difficulties and this in turn resulting in stress and anxiety.

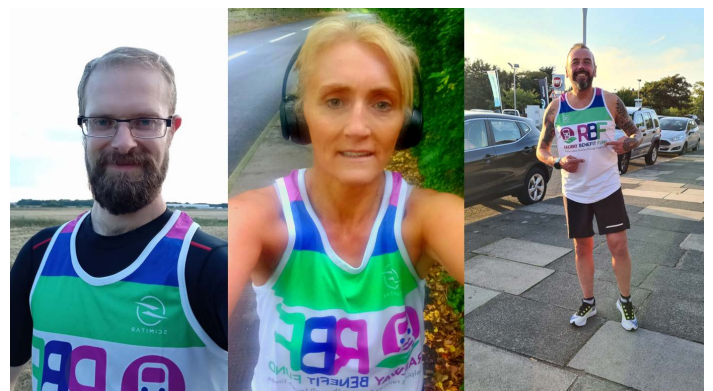

All of our runners had a fantastic day and for Michael and Lindsey it was their first ever marathon experience! Our runners have been fundraising for months for this event- as a result they have raised an amazing £1,592 between them!



It's all about the trains...



We were honoured to attend the train naming for Hixon at Stafford Station and be presented with a replica plaque. This was in memory of those who lost their lives in the terrible accident at the level crossing in Hixon 1968. The event was made possible by Cross Country Trains, Network Rail, Avanti West Coast, Great Western Railway, North Staffs Community Rail, ASLEF, Railway Mission and the community of Hixon.



We were very proud of our President, Pete Waterman, who put on an exciting model railway event at Chester Cathedral over the summer. The 74ft bespoke model railway of the West Coast Main Line was visited by hundreds of people of all ages and will return next year bigger and better!



Pete Waterman was aboard the Avanti West Coast 'Royal Scot' train as it attempted a London to Glasgow trip in record time. Network Rail and The Railway Magazine were part of the event which raised £1,000 for RBF and only just missed the record by 21 seconds!



Avanti West Coast and ALSTOM offered enthusiasts the chance to own some eagerly sought-after railway artefacts. An auction of Super Voyager nameplates and Crewe Station signs, as well as the chance to tour the Central Rivers depot, raised £3,600.



In May the East Midlands 125 Farewell tour, with EMR and the Branch Line Society, raised £3,300 from ticket sales and a raffle. The journey from St Pancras International to Leicester was a great send off.



Mortons Media, Angel Trains, Gemini Rail Services at Wolverton Works, and South Western Railway raised £250 auctioning a Class 442 EMU driver's seat. Antony, who won the driver's seat, also had a tour of Wolverton works when collecting it.

Ambassador Month



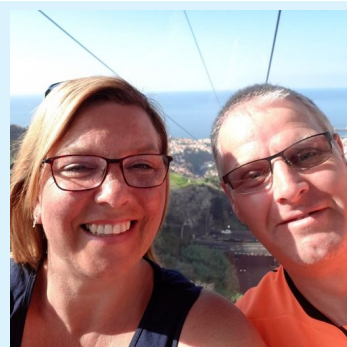

Children's Fund - A Winter's Tale

The winter months can be really expensive for families on a budget.
